1

Actuary



This job is for you if you're strong with numbers. Actuaries use mathematics, statistics, and financial theory to analyze the economic costs of risk and uncertainty. Most actuaries work for insurance companies. The median annual wage for actuaries was \$111,030 in May 2020.

Human Resource Specialist



Human resource experts, who earn an average of \$63,490 as of May 2020, will be employed as long as companies have employees. Employment of human resources specialists is projected to grow 10 percent from 2020 to 2030. A HR Specialist requires skills like decision-making, communication, interpersonal and attention to detail.

Market Research Analyst



They assess market circumstances by conducting surveys and research, analyzing data, and calculating sales probabilities. Salaries are solid, averaging \$65,810 in 2020, with an industry growth potential of 22% through 2030, much faster than the average for all occupations.

Epidemiologist



Epidemiologists study patterns and causes of diseases and administer public health programs. You'll need a master's degree – a Ph.D. is preferable – but the pay is decent, with an average salary of \$74,560 in 2020 and demand expected to climb by 30% by 2030.

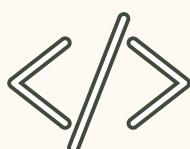
Occupational Therapist



They treat patients with injuries or disabilities in private practice or in hospitals and nursing homes, assisting them in returning to normal life. This area requires a master's degree, but the compensation is good – \$86,280 on average in 2020 – and the job growth will continue at a healthy 17% through 2030.

Software Developer



They assess client requirements before designing, developing, and testing new software. In 2020, the average salary was \$110,140 and the Bureau of Labor Statistics predicts a 22% increase in job growth in the next ten years.

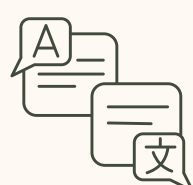
Diagnostic Medical Sonographer



They operate special imaging equipment to create images or to conduct tests. In 2020, the typical salary for diagnostic medical sonographers was \$75,920, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Only an associate's degree is required to work in this area.

Interpreters and Translators



According to the BLS, demand for interpreters who speak several languages and translators who write multiple languages would increase by 24 percent by 2030 as more enterprises engage in international trade. Interpreters and translators made an average of \$52,330 in 2020 with a college degree and language ability.

9

Pharmacist



The demand for prescription medicine will rise as the population ages, as will the demand for pharmacists. In 2020, the average salary was \$128,710. To work as a pharmacist, you must have a Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) degree and be licensed in your state.

Computer Systems Analyst



According to the BLS, demand for computer systems analysts will expand at a healthy 7% through 2030. In 2020, the average compensation for computer systems analysts was \$93,730. These analysts assess their employers' IT requirements, conduct research into new technologies, configure systems, and supervise equipment installation.
